If you elect to enroll in UPMC Benefit Management Services Direct Deposit service, your Direct Dollar Benefit Account reimbursements will be deposited in the account you specify instead of being issued as a check. To enroll in direct deposit, complete this authorization form to permit all parties to deposit your Direct Dollar Benefit Account reimbursement into your bank account, sign this authorization form, attach a voided check for verification of all financial institution information, and send it to UPMC Benefit Management Services. (If your bank account is a savings account and a document is not available, please verify account and routing number with your bank.) Please note that only one bank account will be accepted for all reimbursements.

If you have enrolled and change your bank account, check the "Account Change" box, complete the new "Financial Institution Information", attach a voided check (unless your account is a savings account), and send it to UPMC Benefit Management Services. You can find this form under the "Information" tab when you log onto your account.
