

The Global Competence Certificate Program, offered through the Faculty and Staff Development Program (FSDP), is designed to build participants' awareness and understanding of diverse cultures, while learning about University policies and resources that support our strategic goal of embracing the world. To complete this certificate program, participants must:

- ✓ Complete, in any order, the two required sessions and four elective sessions, and participate in capstone conversation. Note: Participants may choose to complete all four elective sessions within one track to have that specialty noted on their certificate of completion.

- ✓ After completing all six sessions, return this form to ucis@pitt.edu. Once attendance is validated, participants will receive an email invitation to the next capstone conversation.
